





# Impact Harvest Forum Nurturing Impact through Accelerators: Seeding and Scaling up Inclusive Businesses

## **Background**

Private sector adoption of inclusive and sustainable practices stands as a linchpin in scaling the delivery of low-cost essential services and lifting people out of poverty at scale. Towards this end, it is imperative to ensure that innovations emerging from the startup and enterprise ecosystem prioritize impact, while likewise supporting existing SMEs in their transition towards impact-driven practices.

Business development support services that incorporate impact into their methodologies are crucial for unlocking the social and environmental potential of inclusive and impactful businesses. However, in the Asia-Pacific region, existing business support has predominantly favored tech-based startups and scalable ventures, traditional SME development support, leaving a gap in appropriate capacity building, policy support, and knowledge transfer for impact-driven startups and inclusive businesses.

This session aims to explore the pivotal role of incubators and accelerators and business support organizations in the development of inclusive and impact businesses and aims to identify concrete actions and partnerships that will potentially strengthen their capacity to embed impact into their programmes, and the enterprises they work with.

#### **Objectives**

- To explore the demand for impact by business and identify best practice of incubators, accelerators and business support organisations that nurture impact.
- To identify gaps in the capacity of incubators, accelerators incubators, accelerators and business support organisations to nurture impact.
- To identify opportunities and concrete actions that can be taken by governments to strengthen the ability of incubators and accelerators to nurture impact.
