

### Regional trade in Asia-Pacific

- Recovering after the COVID-19 crisis
  - Trade growth in 2023 expected to be modest, and slower than 2022
- Uncertainties ahead
  - Trade frictions, recession risks, geopolitical tensions
  - · Long-term dynamics of value chains yet to be seen
- Preferential trade agreements in the region have increased over time, and expanded in scope to cover issues related to sustainable development
- Reflecting the accelerating digital transformation, digital services trade in the region has risen significantly







# Building trade competitiveness in a digital economy: Simplify and digitalize trade procedures

- Digital trade facilitation reduces trade costs, enables participation in digital economy and global and regional supply chains
- Implementation of trade facilitation and paperless trade measures have improved but vary widely across countries in the region
- Full implementation could cut average trade costs by more than 13 per cent
  - Benefits less advantaged groups such as women traders and MSMEs, and environment

- National readiness assessments for cross-border paperless trade and development of initial action plans (17 countries)
- Capacity building, e.g., UNNExT WCO-ESCAP Masterclass, ESCAP-ADB-ICC Webinar Series on Cross-Border Paperless Trade Facilitation, Asia-Pacific Trade Facilitation Forum
- · Cross-border Paperless Trade Toolkit co-released with WTO and UNCITRAL



# Building trade competitiveness in a digital economy: Foster an enabling digital trade environment

- Attaining benefits of digitalization will require enabling environment that:
  - Facilitates secure and efficient cross-border digital transactions
  - Reduces policy ambiguity and restrictions
  - Promotes interoperability
- Policy and regulatory convergence reduces trade/business costs and enhances digital trust
- Practical to start cooperation where some consensus exists, e.g., NTMs and technical standards

- ESCAP-ECA-ECLAC Regional Digital Trade Integration Index (RDTII) and associated Asia-Pacific Digital Trade Regulatory Review (APDTR) 2022
- Databases on digital trade regulations
- Technical assistance and capacity building on digital trade policy





#### Making trade more inclusive and sustainable: Promote climate-smart trade

- Much room for trade to become climate-smart
  - Asia-Pacific largest emitter of greenhouse gases
- Policy options include:
  - 1. Liberalize trade in climate-smart and other environmental goods and services
  - 2. Phase out fossil fuel subsidies
  - 3. Adopt climate-smart non-tariff measures
  - 4. Accelerate trade digitalization
  - 5. Transition to climate-smart transport
  - 6. Incorporate climate considerations in regional trade agreements
  - 7. Prepare for carbon pricing

### Making trade more inclusive and sustainable: Ensure trade resilience in times of crisis

- Urgency for trade resilience, given disruptions and challenges in pandemic and recent crises
- Better coordination and predictability needed in trade agreements
  - To keep trade flowing during emergencies
  - Regional cooperation to develop crisis-mitigation provisions, crisis management and coordination mechanisms
- Enhance support to countries with special needs, which are hardest hit in crises

- Workshops and courses on trade policy analysis and trade negotiations
- Online tools, e.g. Trade Intelligence and Negotiation Adviser (TINA)





# Issues for consideration / recommendations

- Recommend that increased focus be placed on making trade in the region more competitive, sustainable and inclusive, and that the secretariat continue and expand its analytical research, capacity building and technical assistance efforts in relation to digital trade, trade digitalization, trade agreements, climate-smart trade, trade resilience in times of crisis, and graduation from least developed country status.
- Recommend that cooperation on cross-border paperless trade be further enhanced and encourage accession to the Framework Agreement on Facilitation of Cross-border Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific.
- Recommend the inclusion of provisions, in future regional trade and cooperation agreements, to limit disruption to trade in times of pandemics and other crises.
